Pray until you Pray

Prayer is crucial in the life of the Christian, and the church. It is an activity of relationship. Prayer is crucial for the mission of the church. Through these readings I want to encourage your prayer life, for yourself, and for our part in the local mission. These readings follow the example of prayer and the teaching on prayer in the life of Jesus. When his disciples saw him pray they wanted to learn from him. Jesus regularly took time out in a quiet place to pray. Prayer preceded significant moments in his life. 'May we continue to pray, to depend on your Holy Spirit and to glorify you. Amen. '

As Jesus prayed he modelled prayer for us and through his atoning ministry, enabled us access to the throne room of our heavenly Father. I encourage you to read the passage, reflect on the question and pray in response. Our heavenly Father loves to hear from us. I also encourage you to pray 'the vision prayer' so as a church we undergird our ministry activities in prayer. Each vision prayer point ties into our vision, mission and strategy. We express our mission in the following way and encourage you to pray for our mission:

Our Mission Prayer

Our gracious God,
We pray that you will help us to proclaim our Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ, so that everyone around us will hear his call to repent, trust and serve Christ in love, and be established in the fellowship of his disciples while we await his return. May we continue to pray, to depend on your Holy Spirit and to glorify you. Amen.

Prayer 1.

Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has ascended into heaven, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin. Let us then approach God’s throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need. Hebrews 4:14-16

What is the connection between Jesus and our prayers? What encouragement is there to pray here?

Prayer: Give thanks that we can approach God’s throne with confidence.

Vision prayer: Pray God uses us to see Christ honoured as Lord and Saviour in every community in our city, especially the Forest.

Prayer 2.

Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them he was hungry. The Devil said to Him, “If You are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread.” But Jesus answered him, “It is written: Man must not live on bread alone.” Luke 4:1-4

What sustains Jesus? How can this sustain you?
How does Jesus resist temptation?

Prayer: Pray you will seek sustenance in God’s Word.

Pray we would depend on the Holy Spirit for equipping in all our ministries.

Prayer 3.

The devil showed Jesus all the kingdoms of the world. And he said to him, “I will give you all their authority and splendour; it has been given to me, and I can give it to anyone I want to. If you worship me, it will all be yours.” Jesus answered, “It is written: ‘Worship the Lord your God and serve him only.’ Luke 4:5-8

How does Jesus face the temptation of material possessions of the world? What does your life say about what you worship? Jesus receives his authority via the way of the cross, how does he resist temptation here?

Prayer: Confess to God when you put other things first in your life before him.

Vision Prayer: Pray we commit ourselves and our planning to making disciples, through proclaiming the Lord Jesus Christ, and calling all to repentance and faith in Jesus as Lord and Saviour.

Prayer 4.

The devil led him to Jerusalem and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. “If you are the Son of God,” he said, “throw yourself down from here. For it is written:

‘He will command his angels concerning you to guard you carefully; they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone.’” Jesus answered, “It is said: Do not put the Lord your God to the test.” When the devil had finished all this tempting, he left him until an opportune time. Luke 4:9-13

What does Jesus teach you in this incident? Have you ever tried to test God? How does Jesus resist temptation here?

Prayer: Pray that you might resist temptation as it comes and give thanks that Jesus did.

Vision: Pray we would love our family, neighbours and friends as God loves us in Jesus. Pray for our friends and neighbours in the Forest

Prayer 5.

During the days of Jesus’ life on earth, he offered up prayers and petitions with fervent cries and tears to the one who could save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Son though he was, he learned obedience from what he suffered and, once made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him and was designated by God to be high priest in the order of Melchizedek. Hebrews 5:7-10

What does Hebrews say about the prayer life of Jesus? How does his prayer help us? What does the perfect obedience of Jesus mean for us?

Prayer: Thank God for the reverent life of Jesus.

Vision Prayer: Pray we will live lives worthy of Jesus where ever we are.

Prayer 6.

They went to a place called Gethsemane, and Jesus said to his disciples, “Sit here while I pray.” He took Peter, James and John along with him, and he began to be deeply distressed and troubled. “My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death,” he said to them. “Stay here and keep watch.” Going a little farther, he fell to the ground and prayed that if possible the hour might pass from him. Abba, Father,” he said, “everything is possible for you. Take this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will.” Then he returned to his disciples and found them sleeping. “Simon,” he said to Peter, “are you asleep? Couldn’t you keep watch for one hour? Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak.” Once more he went away and prayed the same thing. Mark 14:32-39

What emotion does this prayer carry?

What is Jesus prayer request?

What is the cup he asks not to drink?

What do we learn about prayer from this?

Why would Jesus pray this?

Prayer: Thank God that Jesus bore your judgment at the cross.

Vision Prayer: Pray we will reach, mature, and equip Youth and Young Adults in our orbit through SRE, Element, and Camp David.

Prayer 7.

When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified him there, along with the criminals—one on his right, the other on his left. Jesus said, “Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing.” And they divided up his clothes by casting lots. The people stood watching, and the rulers even sneered at him. They said, “He saved others; let him save himself if he is God’s Messiah, the Chosen One.” Luke 23:33-35

What does Jesus model in this prayer?

Where does he get his capacity to forgive?
Who do you need to forgive?

Prayer: Pray that you might forgive as God has forgiven you.

Vision Prayer: Pray for our children's ministries and their leadership, including our Kid's churches, 180, SRE and holiday Kid's club.

Prayer 8.

At noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. And at three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" (Which means "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"). When some of those standing near heard this, they said, 'Listen, he's calling Elijah.' Someone ran, filled a sponge with wine vinegar, put it on a staff, and offered it to Jesus to drink. 'Now leave him alone. Let's see if Elijah comes to take him down,' he said. With a loud cry, Jesus breathed his last. The curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. And when the centurion, who stood there in front of Jesus, saw how he died, he said, 'Surely this man was the Son of God!' Mark 15: 33-39

What do you think is happening in this moment? What is he lamenting?

Prayer: Thank God for the atoning ministry of Jesus.

Vision Prayer: Pray we reach, mature, and equip Seniors in our orbit, at the Village and in our family and friendship networks.

Prayer 9.

Since the children have flesh and blood, he too shared in their humanity so that by his death he might break the power of him who holds the power of death—that is, the devil—and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death. For surely it is not angels he helps, but Abraham's descendants. For this reason he had to be made like them, or like his brothers, fully human in every way, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high

priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself suffered when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted. Hebrews 2:14-18

What does Hebrews 2 teach us about the significance of Jesus temptation? How does Jesus help us in our temptation?

Prayer: Cast your temptations on Jesus as he is able to help you.

Vision Prayer: Pray for our ministry to Seniors, our ministry in the Village and our Craft Group.

Prayer 10.

After Jesus said this, he looked toward heaven and prayed: “Father, the hour has come. Glorify your Son, that your Son may glorify you. For you granted him authority over all people that he might give eternal life to all those you have given him. Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent. I have brought you glory on earth by finishing the work you gave me to do. And now, Father, glorify me in your presence with the glory I had with you before the world began. John 17: 1-5

How does Jesus enjoy relationship with his heavenly Father?
What does this teach us about the relationship between the Father and the Son? What does this prayer show about their relationship?

Prayer: Ask God to open your eyes to the glory of the Son.

Vision Prayer: Pray for our partners in Global mission and their supporting organisations. Pray for wisdom to navigate the COVID-19 situation for the next few years

Prayer 11.

I pray for them. I am not praying for the world, but for those you have given me, for they are yours. All I have is yours, and all you have is mine. And glory has come to me through them. I will remain in the

world no longer, but they are still in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them by the power of your name, the name you gave me, so that they may be one as we are one. My prayer is not that you take them out of the world but that you protect them from the evil one. They are not of the world, even as I am not of it. Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth. As you sent me into the world, I have sent them into the world. For them I sanctify myself, that they too may be truly sanctified. John 17:9-19

What does Jesus pray for the apostles? What do we learn to pray for? How is this prayer encouraging?

Prayer: Pray that God will protect our church family.

Vision Prayer: Pray for prayerfulness, generosity, care and regular communication for each of our mission partners and their organisations.

Prayer 12.

“My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one— I in them and you in me—so that they may be brought to complete unity. Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me. John 17:20-23

What does Jesus pray for everyone who believes through the Apostle’s message? How is this an encouragement for us?

Prayer: Pray for the local unity of God’s people.

Vision Prayer: Pray we will engage with our local community and create opportunities for evangelism at the local and diocesan levels, both personal and corporate.

Prayer 13.

When all the people were being baptized, Jesus was baptized too. And as he was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: “You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased.” Luke 3: 21-22

What accompanied Jesus prayers?

Is there a connection between prayer and baptism?

How does the Father respond to the Son?

Prayer: Ask God to teach you from the prayer life of Jesus.

Vision Prayer: Pray we might connect with unreached people in our local and cultural sub communities.

Prayer 14.

Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed. Simon and his companions went to look for him, and when they found him, they exclaimed: “Everyone is looking for you!” Jesus replied, “Let us go somewhere else—to the nearby villages—so I can preach there also. That is why I have come. ”So he travelled throughout Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and driving out demons. Mark 1:35-39

What does this passage teach us about Jesus’ priorities in his mission and what can we learn about these priorities?

Prayer: Pray that you will make God’s mission your priority.

Vision Prayer: Pray for new opportunities and new initiatives in outreach and discipleship across our ministries.

Prayer 15.

While Jesus was in one of the towns, a man came along who was covered with leprosy. When he saw Jesus, he fell with his face to the ground and begged him, “Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean.” Jesus reached out his hand and touched the man. “I am willing,” he said. “Be clean!” And immediately the leprosy left him.

Then Jesus ordered him, “Don’t tell anyone, but go, show yourself to the priest and offer the sacrifices that Moses commanded for your cleansing, as a testimony to them.” Yet the news about him spread all the more, so that crowds of people came to hear him and to be healed of their sicknesses. But Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed. Luke 5:12-16

What do you learn about prayer here?

How can you shape your prayer life?

Why does Jesus make the world wait?

Prayer: Pray that you will take control of your diary and prayer life.

Vision Prayer: Pray our congregational gatherings are significant places for spiritual growth and engagement in service.

Prayer 16.

Therefore, brothers and sisters, since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is, his body, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching. Hebrews 10 :19-25

What access has Jesus given us through his death?
How does this relate to our prayer life? Why should we pray together?
What confidence do we get to pray?

Prayer: Thank God for the cleansing of your heart through the blood of Jesus.

Vision Prayer: Pray for our music teams across the congregations that they may help us praise God through 'psalms, hymns and spiritual songs.'

Prayer 17.

One day Jesus was praying in a certain place. When he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples."

He said to them, "When you pray, say:

**'Father, hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come.**

Give us each day our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins,

for we also forgive everyone who sins against us

And lead us not into temptation.' " Luke 11:1-4

What did the disciples see in Jesus' prayer life?
How can this strengthen your prayer life?

Prayer: Pray that God will deepen and broaden your prayer life through the Lord's prayer.

Vision Prayer: Pray for other person centered service of all our members, up front and behind the scenes. Pray for our back office to enable front-line ministry.

Prayer 18.

Then Jesus said to them, "Suppose you have a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; a friend of mine on a journey has come to me, and I have no food

to offer him.’ And suppose the one inside answers, ‘Don’t bother me. The door is already locked, and my children and I are in bed. I can’t get up and give you anything.’ I tell you, even though he will not get up and give you the bread because of friendship, yet because of your shameless audacity he will surely get up and give you as much as you need. Luke 11:5-8

What is Jesus teaching us about prayer in this parable? How can you develop this characteristic of prayer life?

Prayer: Pray for persistence in your prayer life over long term issues. Pray for sustenance of our long term sick at church.

Vision Prayer: Pray we will strengthen our invitation, welcoming and integration processes across our congregations.

Prayer 19.

“So I say to you: Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. “Which of you fathers, if your son asks for a fish, will give him a snake instead? Or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!” Luke 11:9-13

What does Jesus teach us about God’s response to prayer? How does this help us to think relationally about prayer?

Prayer: Give thanks to God for his generosity poured out in your life.

Vision Prayer: Pray for enriching Christian fellowship through our small group network.

Prayer 20.

Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up. He said: “In a certain town there was a judge who neither feared God nor cared what people thought. And there was a widow in that town who kept coming to him with the plea, ‘Grant me justice against my adversary.’

“For some time he refused. But finally he said to himself, ‘Even though I don’t fear God or care what people think, yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will see that she gets justice, so that she won’t eventually come and attack me!’ ”

And the Lord said, “Listen to what the unjust judge says. And will not God bring about justice for his chosen ones, who cry out to him day and night? Will he keep putting them off? I tell you, he will see that they get justice, and quickly. However, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?” Luke 18:1-8

What is Jesus teaching about prayer?

When do you lose heart with prayer issues?

Prayer: Pray for persistence in prayer issues where you can lose heart.

Vision Prayer: Pray for our small group leaders for their dedication, preparation in the Word and leadership. Pray for refreshment in a COVID weary world leading COVID weary people.

Day 21.

Jesus took Peter, John and James with him and went up onto a mountain to pray. As he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning. Two men, Moses and Elijah, appeared in glorious splendour, talking with Jesus. They spoke about his departure, which he was about to bring to fulfilment at Jerusalem. Peter and his companions were very sleepy, but when they became fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him. As the men were

leaving Jesus, Peter said to him, “Master, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.” (He did not know what he was saying.) While he was speaking, a cloud appeared and covered them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. A voice came from the cloud, saying, “This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him.” When the voice had spoken, they found that Jesus was alone. The disciples kept this to themselves and did not tell anyone at that time what they had seen. Luke 9:28-30

What does this remind us about the identity of Jesus?

Prayer: Pray that your eyes will be open to the glory of Jesus.

Vision Prayer: Pray we will strengthen personal and family devotions through prayer and Bible reading.

Prayer 22.

As Jesus and his disciples were on their way, he came to a village where a woman named Martha opened her home to him. She had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord’s feet listening to what he said. But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, “Lord, don’t you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!” “Martha, Martha,” the Lord answered, “you are worried and upset about many things, but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her.” Luke 10:38-42

Why is Martha frustrated? Why does Jesus commend Mary?

What do you learn about yourself from this situation? Why can the world wait?

Prayer: Pray that you put growing in Jesus as priority in your life.

Vision Prayer: Pray we continue to identify and unleash the gifts of church members to serve in our existing and new ministries.

Prayer 23.

“Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.” Matthew 11:28-30

What do you learn from this prayer of Jesus?

What burdens do you need to cast on Jesus in prayer? How does this encourage you to pray?

Prayer: Cast your burdens on Jesus for he cares for you.

Vision Prayer: Pray that we will be deliberate in caring for the weary, sick, the long term sufferers, the doubting, grieving, tempted, and disconnected people among us.

Prayer 24.

“And when you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. But when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.” Matthew 6:5-6

What does Jesus think wrong prayer looks like?

What is the prayer lesson here?

Prayer: Confess the hypocrisy of your prayer life to God.

Vision Prayer: Pray for strengthening leadership skills across our ministries, including for our staff.

Prayer 25.

**And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him.
Matthew 6:7-8**

What dangers in prayer is Jesus warning about?

How can these bad habits manifest in your prayer life?

Prayer: Thank God that he is your generous heavenly father and knows your needs, so you don't have to babble on.

Vision Prayer: Pray for generosity amongst members in finances, time and service.

Prayer 26.

“This, then, is how you should pray:

**“ ‘Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
And forgive us our debts,
as we also have forgiven our debtors.
And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from the evil one
Matthew 6:9-13**

What is the significance of being invited to call God, Father? How does this challenge the way you pray?

How does this challenge what you pray for?

Prayer: Pray that God's name will be honoured in your life.

Vision Prayer: Pray for strengthening and training of those who serve the tech of our gatherings, and help us to stay digitally connected especially in these COVID times

Prayer 27.

Then people brought little children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them and pray for them. But the disciples rebuked them. Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these. "When he had placed his hands on them, he went on from there. Matthew 19:13-15

What is Jesus' response to the children? What do you think he prayed for them? What do we learn from Jesus about children?

Prayer: Pray for the children in your earthly family and your church family.

Vision Prayer: Pray for effective training in outreach, welcoming and leadership

Prayer 28.

One of those days Jesus went out to a mountainside to pray, and spent the night praying to God. When morning came, he called his disciples to him and chose twelve of them, whom he also designated apostles. Luke 6:12-13

Why did Jesus pray on this occasion?

How can prayer help our ministry team building?

What can you pray for the ministry team in our church?

Prayer: Pray for the ministry team in our church.

Vision Prayer: Pray for our church property plans so we can organize our plans as needed for effective ministry and wise stewardship. Pray for our use of 701 ministry hub and public access.

Prayer 29.

Once when Jesus was praying in private and his disciples were with him, he asked them, “Who do the crowds say I am?”

They replied, “Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, that one of the prophets of long ago has come back to life.”

“But what about you?” he asked. “Who do you say I am?” Peter answered, “God’s Messiah.” Jesus strictly warned them not to tell this to anyone. And he said, “The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life.”

Luke 9:18-22

What question was Jesus thinking about during this time of prayer? What do you think of Peter’s answer? What did Jesus add to it?

Prayer: Pray that God will open your eyes to the majesty of Jesus.

Vision Prayer: Pray for our parish council and wardens that they might be good stewards of our staff, finances and property on our behalf for the sake of our mission.

Prayer 30.

Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, “The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.” **Matthew 9:35-38**

What does Jesus pray for? How does this mission prayer affect you?

Prayer: Pray that God will raise up workers for the ministries you are involved in.

Vision Prayer: Pray for our congregational oversight teams that they might be effective in enabling pastoral care, ministry and mission in their congregation.

Prayer 31.

Because of this oath, Jesus has become the guarantor of a better covenant. Now there have been many of those priests, since death prevented them from continuing in office; but because Jesus lives forever, he has a permanent priesthood. Therefore he is able to save completely those who come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for them. Hebrews 7:22-25

What does this teach us about the present ministry of Jesus and prayer? How is this an encouragement to pray?
